• Living Style

Transportation

1. The Stone Age:

The Stone Age was long ago when people

used stones to make tools and weapons. They lived in caves or simple huts and hunted animals and gathered plants for food.



2. The Bronze Age:

The Bronze Age came after the Stone Age. People made tools and weapons from bronze, a metal made by mixing copper and tin. These stronger tools helped with farming and building better houses.

3. The Iron Age:

The Iron Age came after the Bronze Age. People made tools and weapons from iron, which is stronger than bronze. Iron tools helped them farm better and build bigger houses, making life easier and helping communities grow.
