Activities:

- To brain storm the students, take an apple in the classroom ask some question about it
 - What is it?
 - Have you ever eaten an apple?
 - Have you drunk apple juice?

Development

Model Reading:

- Tell the students that they are going to learn to write the letter "a"
- Explain that they are going to learn how to write the letter "a".

- Point to “a” on the alphabet wall chart. Ask: What sound does this make? Praise and say: Yes, /a/ ... /a/ for ant! Yes, /a/ ... /a/ for apple! Yes, /a/ ... /a/ for alligator!
- Show the students how to write the lower case ‘a’ on the board. Sound out /a/ as you write it.
 - Show the students how to draw the shape in the air with a finger, repeating the sound along with you.
 - Tell them that letters can change their forms but their sounds remain the same.
 - Write the letter “a” on the whiteboard or paste flashcards of the letter “a” on whiteboard.
- Repeat the sound of letter “a” and its vocabulary.
